Words that represent voices, sounds, and the state or movement of people or things in sound.

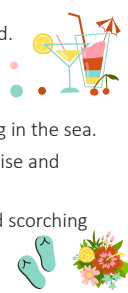


Examples of the introduced onomatopoeia
